In addition to this study, Steven, Juan, and I conducted studies with Beverly Baker (Montego Bay) and Cynthia Clark (Sav-la-mar). Another study at the Craft Market in MoBay was disrupted by an aggressive Seventh Day Adventist.

Jamaicans are amazingly open to Bible study. They do not get offended with talking plainly about their life's struggles and the application of God's word. However, the rampant immorality poses a huge obstacle to their making a commitment to Christ. Pray for them and the future of their troubled nation. Our first week of work was with the Medley's. The church building is located in Westmoreland Parish in the community of Grange Hill, not far from the sugar cane fields. We conducted classses for all ages each morning, and worship services in the evening. A friendly game of soccer with the neighborhood children a few days before influenced them to attend our classes.

Our second week of work was in Montego Bay. Maxwell James is the preacher there. Since the compeltion of their new building, the church continues to grow in numbers. While much of our crew conducted morning classes for the children, Juan Garcia, Steven Harper, and me worked the Craft Market for Bible studies.
